### **The Scandinavian Countries Cooperate**

Suggested by the Swedish king and after an invitation from King Christian of Denmark, the prime ministers and foreign ministers of the Scandinavian countries met in the royal Palace in Copenhagen last Thursday to consult with each other about common interests when it comes to the problems during the war. The main subject was to discuss trade problems and by cooperating try to receive respect for the rights of trading from the countries participating in the war. The Swedish representatives will probably also suggest that can lead to a peace plan. At this point the three Scandinavian countries could only state that they would be willing to work with America and the other neutral countries.
