Dearest Lover,
as I bought ~~me~~ a new pen
and need to initiate it, you
are to receive the first from
it. This is Fair week and
so much doing to tell you
about. Sarg and Kate took
me to the Fair last night, we
saw a play by the ^{Wells} Barneyle
Stock Company. It was very
good and I wish you could
have seen it too. Madge and
Onley were there too. They asked
all about you. Onley said to
tell you he made thirty bushels
of wheat off of a hundred acres.
They couldn't get a man to help
drill wheat, so they hired a Cook

We have Harry's bond and
I will make up the rest and
Harry can pay me when he
comes back. I will pay his
insurance as soon as I get
some money. His allowance
hasn't come yet. and I can
take from that what I have
paid out. Harry doesn't get

Harry both last week. I wrote
to Harry to-day and will write to
Glenn too.

I am sending you your
mother's letter. I think I will

Our professor came this morning before we were up and told us we were to have vacation today. Do you know dear I use your watch in school? They haven't the electric bells in yet.

I got my money Saturday for serving on the primary election #3. 41. Mr Sehave spoke to me and looked three times for my check. Then he told me there just wasn't any check for Miss Secker

there must be some mistake.
So Mrs. Reynolds received her
money. I am getting used to my
name over here. Everyone called
me Helen in Ellsworth.

I sent one of ~~my~~ Harry's letters
to your mother too. He mentioned
you in several places and it
was quite interesting but don't
know whether she could read
it or not. He is such a poor
niter. Bergh looks so thin this
fall he works too hard.

Do you know, Madge looks
just fine, I never saw her look
better.

Write when you can Sweetheart
I love you with all my heart.
God bless you and bring you
back unharmed. Helen.

Sep 17 1918

Dear Helen I will write
you a few lines to thank you
for the package the coat fits
Ada fine and I can make the
skirt fit all right I can make
use of all it will save buying
as every thing is so high
well I glad you are feeling good
I expect you do feel better when
you have some thing to do
I do I knit for the red cross
when I have time I got a
letter from the insurance
saying I was entitled to
\$5000 and ^{they} sent an affidavit
to be filled out I filled it out
and sent it back I think I
will get the back pay soon
we ordered a turnstone it
cost one hundred and fifty dollars

I havent herd from Gleason
yet and I havent had a letter
from Albert since the 7 of ~~the~~
aug it was like the one
you got the same time
I wrote to them both last
week I dont ~~think~~ see why he
darent get my letters I adress
them like the the adress he
sent me you ask about dying cloth
I have good luck I always
go by the directions on the pack^{age}
I will let you know when I hear
from the boys Albert never wites
much only that he is well and
all right and he has gained a
tittle in weight since was there
our school comence Monday
I ~~made~~ made my dress you gave
me and trimed it with black
it looks good Marie is hear yet
her husband is Operator here in
Geneseo they are going to get a house
here Ema and Lemard was up that
one ago he has a car now

I dreamed of you and about
last night I thought he was home
on a furlough and was going back
I sure thought I would get a
letter to day but I did not I
look for a letter every day since
blown Nettie is still in the
hospital Mary has her children
she is at Wichita I don't know
if you can read this the folks
make so much noise I cannot
write so will close for this
time good by with love to
all
