If I could only hear from you again, every one else is getting letters. yours must be lost for I know you have written or have had some one write for you. When your letter came telling us not to worry I felt so much better but I feel so anxious again. There are so many things that might happen in a base hospital.

There was a letter from Glenn Witter Sept 22. He was well and not in action so far, he had gained 30 lbs. since he landed.



We had received three letters, one from his mother, Bob, and Esther. His new address is Co. D. 350 Inf.

A. P. O. 795 Amer. E. F. France. Poor boy doesn't know you are wounded. He will feel so badly.

Alice and Broulee were to see me last night. Alice asked if Glenn and Esther were engaged - I told her no one knew but Mrs. Reynolds and she said no.

Broulee always makes one feel better as he always seems to know just what to say, but

even then I am so lonesome and so anxious, I don't know what to do.

They are fixing up a window in the bank down town with the pictures of all the Ellsworth boys in France in it. I sent your picture dear, and Harry's too. I will tell you all about it when it is fixed up.

We had two letters from Harry on this mail. He is worried about you as he can't find any trace of you. He works day and night he says. We think



He is terribly homesick.

were in a hospital in Georgia  
and had sent for me and I  
was leaving on the midnight  
I was having a time getting

we have so many accounts  
of the St. Michael's dime, I am  
saving them all.

I wish I could hear from you  
I am getting so restless  
and there was no foreign  
mail in to night, so that means  
two weeks waiting for the  
next mail.



I think the schools will begin  
next week and it will be better  
then. the time won't seem so  
long. Dear do try to tell me  
all you can how you are hurt.  
It seems I can't stand it much  
longer. you told me not to  
worry but dear I don't know  
how you are hurt or how  
you are suffering and I  
can't think of anything else.  
just a month next Tuesday  
since the telegram came  
saying you were seriously  
wounded. It seems as if it  
had been all my life.

I will be twenty eight years  
old next Wednesday. just a  
year ago the next day you  
came home for the first time.  
do you remember dear? and  
you sent me twenty dollars  
for my birthday present? you  
can't send me a thing this  
year but I do hope you can  
write me a nice, long letter. That  
will be the best thing I can  
get from you.  
Perhaps next year we can  
spend our birthdays together.  
It wouldn't be impossible to  
spend your birthday this year



Oh my dear please try hard to  
get word to me. The time is so  
long and I can't think of another  
thing.

Everyone is feeling well and  
waiting for mail from France  
Mrs. Cole hadn't heard from  
her husband since Sept 18.  
But Harry had seen him  
since then. Vincent Wilson  
was slightly wounded too.

Brownlee said he saw Bob  
not long ago in Neb. He was  
looking fine.
