Dearest Albert,

I can surely spend a good
Thanksgiving dear, tonight
I heard from my man. your
mother had a letter from ~~you~~.
Can you imagine how I feel?
To think my darling is walking
around and can do everything
with his hand but mine. I am
so thankful Albert dear for
that, that you have been
spared, it is too bad you
had to be injured at all.
If only I could have born
part of your sufferings dear.
But you will soon be coming

home to me and then
darling we can be together
again and you can tell
me all about everything.
How can I ever tell you
what I am feeling to-night?
I am so happy dear I don't
know what to say to you but
just tell you how I love you
and want you with me.

When I came home on the train
some soldiers were on it
who were released from
Finston to-day. I never saw
such happy boys, they felt
like I do now, just don't
know what to do.

I have been sending your
mail to Co H. Some to Hospital
15 and some to 2H and trust
you have received some. It
was a different A.P.O. than
on this letter.

We have heard from Harry
Nov. 3 - He had been in
the hospital three weeks
and expected to be out in
a few days. He had had
trouble with his bronchial
tubes and then when they
got a little better, some one
sent a phonograph there
and that was as bad as
bronchitis.

we sent your Christmas
box to your company and
hope you get it.
your mother sent your
letter to me and asked me
over for thanksgiving.

Elmer's were coming too.
she was so happy she
didn't know what to do.

I wrote a big long letter
last night Love, dear and
can't think to night as I am
so happy.

may God bless my own
dear man and bring him
home soon,
